48 Contiguous States and the District of Columbia for family units with more than 8 persons, add \$4,180 for each additional person.

1. A child must be between ages 3-5 years old to be eligible for Head Start enrollment. Also, the child must be 3 years old on or before September 1. Children eligible for Early Head Start must be six week old and under three years of age on or by September 1 of the current school year.

Any child with a documented diagnosis will be eligible for acceptance into the Head Start program on his/her third (3rd) birthday or six weeks old, even if his/her birthday comes after September 1.

- 2. Child must be income eligible. (TANF, SSI, or low-income status). (90% low income, 10% over-income).
- 3. All special need children will be accepted regardless of income. (All children with disabilities should be diagnosed before entering the program). The program must enroll 10% of their funded enrollment with children with disabilities.
- 4. All returning Early Head Start and Head Start students will be accepted.
